Present the We the People 2005 Summer Institute

About the Institute

The institute in an intensive, week-long professional development program on the U.S. Constitution and Bill of Rights. The educational institute focuses on history and principles of the constitutional government, the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights, and fosters civic competence and responsibility among elementary, middle, and high school students in public and private schools.

An essential component of the institute is teacher preparation and participation in a simulated congressional hearing as a culminating activity. The hearing is a model for student hearings to be held during the school year.

The institute is a RIGOROUS professional development program that brings teachers to the University of Central Arkansas to work with constitutional scholars from a variety of disciplines. Teachers attend lectures and sessions dedicated to teaching methods appropriate to the We The People: The Citizen and the Constitution curriculum.

Benefits:

- Participate in lecture and discussions on constitutional themes pertinent to the curriculum content, classroom strategies, and performance assessment.
- Participate in simulated congressional hearings as a culminating activity
- Discuss the challenges of teaching civic education and prepare for the culminating hearing
- Lesson plan preparation for use in the classroom
- Classroom set of textbooks and other materials for classroom use

Graduate Credit:

Participants may enroll in three (3) hours of graduate credit at an additional cost of \$555.

Scholarships:

The Center for Civic Education provides scholarship for up to 24 applicants to cover the costs of on-campus room lodging, meals, in-state mileage to and from the institute, and all classroom materials for those who are selected to attend the institute. Participants are responsible for their own transportation to and from the institute. These scholarships are paid directly to the institutes.

**Professional Development worth more than \$2,000 obligates the recipient to conduct a simulated congressional hearing in her/his classroom.



Who Should Attend

Applicants must be a public or private school teacher of grades 3-12 with a valid contract for the 2005-2006 school year. Applicants must also secure administrative support for inclusion of the We The People: The Citizen and the Constitution program in their classroom.

How to Apply

- 2. For those seeking graduate credit, complete the enclosed the Graduate School application and have original transcripts sent directly from the school to the address below in order to be enrolled in the class and receive graduate credit. Graduate tuition (\$555) is to be paid by the participant, as well as the \$25 Graduate School Application fee.
- 3. Secure administrative support for a We The People ... simulated congressional hearing in your classroom.
- 4. Enclose two letters of recommendation from past or present colleagues.

The We The People Institute is designed to accommodate 24 participants. Participation will be awarded to qualified applicants on a first-come-firstserve basis.

Housing

Participants will reside in Baridon Hall during the institute. Baridon Hall provides a suite style, private room living environment. Each room includes two beds, desks with chairs, chest of drawers, and closets, club chair and love seat. Telephone access, and local service long distance is available. Cable TV service, Internet access, and air conditioning/heating, coin operated washers and dryers, and vending machines are also available. Participants will be responsible for bringing bedspreads and sheets, all toiletries (soap, toothpaste, etc.), towels, and trash cans.

Fitness Center

Participants of the institute will have access to UCA's new HPER center that features racquetball, basketball, and tennis courts along with a swimming pools, free weights, bicycles,

and treadmills, just to name a few. The HPER center will accommodate all of your fitness needs.

LITTLE ROCK RIVER MARKET Little Rock, AR- 30 minutes south of Conway The development and construction of the Little Rock River Market reflects the continued national growth of farmers markets and public markets, selling seasonal



foods and having a year-round indoor, fresh food market. The River Market opened with great fanfare in Little Rock, AR on July 5, 1996. The Market is part of a \$300 million riverfront development project designed to utilize the scenic charm of the Arkansas River, the Riverfront Park and existing historical structures along the riverfront. Major elements of the River Market District include: the Central Arkansas Main Public Library, the Arkansas Museum of Discovery, several restaurants/bars, specialty retail stores, residential living, Julius Breckling Riverfront Park, the William J. Clinton Presidential Center,

the Arkansas Arts Center and much more.

THE WILLIAM J. CLINTON PRESIDENTIAL CENTER Little Rock River Market

The Clinton Presidential Center has been designed to encompass the vision of President Clinton and capture the imagination of the millions of visitors who will pass through its doors or linger in its gardens. The Center, located within a 30-acre city park along the south bank of the Arkansas River in Little Rock, is a gift to the American heartland and will serve as the base of operations for President Clinton's national and international public service



initiatives and as a forum for the promotion of progressive ideas. The Presidential Center site includes the Presidential Library and Museum, the renovated Rock Island Railroad Bridge, now a pedestrian bridge

crossing the Arkansas River and the Choctaw Station built in 1899 which will house the Clinton School of Public Service and Clinton Foundation offices.

The building is as useful as it is elegant featuring

an 80 seat theater, banquet hall, café, meeting and seminar rooms, research offices and support space for archivists and scholars. The secure collection of the Clinton Presidential



archives, administered by the National Archives and Record Administration (NARA), is located at and below grade in the Archive building. Its north side is defined as a two story pavilion containing research offices and support spaces for archivists and scholars.



Location

architecture and up-todate technology. With the Ozark foothills to the north and the state capital to the south, UCA is centrally located in Conway, one of the fastest growing cities in the state.


Brewer-Hegeman Conference Center
